



## Season Two Episode Guide

### 1. Lamborghini

Just say the name "Lamborghini" to an auto enthusiast and their heart rate is sure to rise. But Lamborghini now has the Urus, the company's first-ever Super SUV. Can an SUV maintain all the hallmarks of a traditionally accepted Lamborghini? In the season two premiere episode, our hosts pit the Urus against Lamborghini's Huracan Evo sports car to find out.

### 2. McLaren

From Formula 1 wins to legendary supercars, McLaren has become a household name when it comes to performance. Now the company makes a GT, or "Grand Touring," car. Can a car created for comfort and long-distance travel still be a sports car? ### 3. British Invasion - Lotus Evora GT & Aston Martin DBX

In this episode our hosts take a deep dive into the Lotus Evora GT and Aston Martin's entry into the SUV world, the DBX.

### 4. Polestar 2

Polestar has set its sights on changing the world one car at a time. As an offshoot of Volvo, Polestar has evolved from a performance division to an all-electric focus. The Polestar 2 is the company's first fully electric vehicle. Brian and Jennifer head to Detroit, Michigan, the home of the American automobile, to see if this new offering is indeed a game-changer.

### 5. C8 Corvette - Part 1 - Road Trip

Road trip! Jennifer surprises Brian, a Corvette fan and owner, with a road trip in the C8 midengine Corvette. But this isn't just any road trip, they are heading to Bowling Green, Kentucky to the National Corvette Museum and the NCM Motorsports Park to see how the C8 handles both road and track.

### 6. C8 Corvette - Part 2 - Museum & Track

Brian guides viewers on a walk-through of the National Corvette Museum before he and Jennifer take the C8 Corvette out on the track to test the limits of the first ever mid-engine Corvette.

### 7. Audi RS6 Avant

### 9. Ford Mustangs

The Ford Mustang has been a symbol of the American automotive landscape for more than fifty years. However, Ford has released a new "Mustang" in the form of an all-electric crossover. Is the Mach-E worthy of the "Mustang" moniker or simply a marketing ploy? Our hosts spend time with the new Mustang Mach-E on the road and at the Auto Exotica Super Secret Test Facility to find out. There is also a surprise guest with a 5,0-liter V8 under the hood to set the performance bar for the Mach-E!

### 10. Ferrari SF90 Stradale

It's front-wheel drive, rear-wheel drive, and all-wheel drive depending on what mode it's in. Ferrari's latest supercar, the SF90 is a complex piece of engineering that propels the company into the future. Ferrari's first-ever series production plug-in hybrid is a numbers mecha but how does all of that technology transfer to the driving experience?
